



## A Special Opportunity for Licking County Elementary Buildings

**Our Futures in Licking County** will sponsor **PAX Good Behavior Game Training** for at least one elementary building this school year. We will pay for the training (\$4200) and ½ of the \$285 cost of the game per teacher. The building will be responsible for the remaining cost of the games. The 6- hour virtual training can be offered in one session or multiple shorter sessions—you will determine the dates and times of the training. The training can take place at the school or participants homes. The school principal will be expected to attend the training with the staff and to agree to foster implementation. Please submit your request by November 15 if possible, although requests will be taken throughout the school year as well.

- The PAX Good Behavior Game provides teachers and administrators with **practical** tiered-intervention strategies to implement **PBIS** in the classroom.
- The PAX Good Behavior Game promotes **social and emotional learning** in all students.

- **Reduces** disturbing, disruptive, and inattentive behavior
- **Reduces** stress for teachers
- **Improves** lifetime outcomes
